
LT. CMDR. JOHN ROBERT MASSMAN



"FACILITY INSPECTION PROBLEM"

MANY PEOPLE HAVE GOTTEN CONFUSED IN THE CURRENT FACILITY INSPECTION PROGRAM. ALTHOUGH IT IS TRUE THAT CG305 REQUIRES THE MEMBER TO HAVE HIS FACILITY INSPECTED, THE FLOTILLA COMMANDER HAS A RESPONSIBILITY ALSO.

THE FLOTILLA COMMANDER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF HIS FLOTILLA. THIS INCLUDES INSPECTION. THE NECESSITY FOR WAVIERS, CHANGE OF ADDRESS, NOTICE OF FACILITY SALE ARE MATTERS OF FLOTILLA ADMINISTRATION AND THUS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FLOTILLA COMMANDER.

IN MANY CASES MEMBERS ADVISE THAT THEY HAVE BEEN ILL. CERTAINLY IN THE COURSE OF A YEAR A FLOTILLA COMMANDER SHOULD HAVE FOUND OUT WHAT CAUSES THE ABSENCE OF A MEMBER. FOR THE MEMBER TO ADVISE IN SEPTEMBER THAT HE HAS BEEN SICK ALL YEAR DOES NOT SPEAK WELL FOR THE COMMUNICATION IN THE FLOTILLA.

ALSO, SEVERAL MEMBERS EHEN CONTACTED ABOUT A LACK OF FACILITY EXAMINATION TELL US THEY HAVE HAD THEIR FACILITY EXAMINED, AND AS PROOF SUBMIT A COPY OF A COURTESY MOTOR BOAT EXAMINATION. HERE AGAIN, A LACK OF COMUNICATION EXISTS BETWEEN THE MEMBER AND HIS FLOTILLA. IF THIS MEMBER HAS COMPLETED HIS BASIC QUALIFICATION COURSE HE SHOULD KNOW THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A COURTESY EXAMINATION AND A FACILITY INSPECTION.

THEN, THE FINAL POINT WE ARE ADVISED IN SEPTEMBER THAT BOATS ARE NOT BIG ENOUGH TO BE LISTED AS FACILITES. WHY, THEN, WERE CHARACTERISTICS REPORTS PLACED ON FILE IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE. NO ONE CAN SAY IN WHICH CASE THE MEMBER IS AT FAULT, OR THE FLOTILLA IS AT FAULT. OVER THE LAST NINE MONTHS THERE HAVE BEEN TWO OPPORTUNITIES FOR FLOTILLAS TO BRING THEIR FACILITY RECORDS UP TO DATE. IN ADDITION ON TWO OCCASIONS DURING THIS PERIOD LISTS OF MEMBERS NEEDING INSPECTIONS WENT TO THE FLOTILLAS. THIS SHOWS THAT THE INFORMATION WAS AVAILABLE !!!!! of yes yes

MANY FLOTILLA COMMANDERS, RESTING ON THE STATEMENT THAT FACILITY INSPECTION IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE MEMBERS, HAVE FORGOTTEN THEIR OWN RESPONSIBILITY TO ADMINISTER THE FACILITY INSPECTION PROGRAM. YES YES

THIS DOES NOT SAY THAT THE MEMBERS REASONS ARE NOT VALID. IT DOES POINT OUT HOWEVER, THAT IF WE TO EXPAND THE AULILIARY. WE HAVE TO PAY MORE ATTENTION TO INTERNAL COMMUNICATIONS AND FLOTILLA RESPONSIBILITES.

YOU CAN ALWAYS TELL THE GOOD GUYS BY THEIR WHITE HATS....THE COAST GUARD STATION IN PORTLAND, ORE, RECENTLY RECEIVED A RADIO CALL FROM THE WIFE OF A DEPUTY SHERIFF. THE DEPUTY ASKED FOR COAST GUARD HELP. YES YES

THE COAST GUARD IS MOVING AHEAD WITH IT'S EFFORT TO GET A NUCLEAR-POWERED ICE BREAKER. THE NUCLEAR UTILITY SERVICES CORP. OF WASHINGTON, D. C., AND ITS TWO SUBCONTRACTORS, HYDRONAUTICS AND NEW YORK SHIP-BUILDING, WERE RECENTLY DIRECTED TO PROCEED ON A SIX MONTH STUDY TO VALUATE PROPULSION PLANTS FOR MODERN POLAR ICEBREAKERS BEING DESIGNED AS REPLACE-MENTS FOR THE 'WIND' CLASS. THEY WILL PREPARE MATERIAL ON THE POSSIBLE USE OF NUCLEAR POWER OR ANY OF A NUMBER OF FOSSIL FUEL PLANTS, SUCH AS DIESELS, GAS TURBINES AND STEAM BOILERS YE YES.

ALTERNATE CONVERSION SYSTEMS SUCH AS D.C. ELECYRIC, CONTROLLABLE PITCH PROPELLERS AND HYDRAULIC CLUTCHES ARE ALSO TO BE STUDIED FOR APPLICATION TO BOTH NUCLEAR AND NON-NUCLEAR MAIN PLANTS.

ONE PHASE OF THE STUDY IS TO COVER THE IMPLICATIONS TO THE COAST GUARD, AND THE NATION IF THE COAST GUARD SHOULD CHOOSE NUCLEAR POWER FOR THE FORTHCOMMING POLAR ICEBREAKER. ALL ARE COURTESY MOTOR-BOAT EXAMINERS AND ALL BUT ONE ARE ALSO RATED INSTRUCTORS. TWO COMMODORES HOLD THE TOP RATING AUXILIARY OPERATIONAL (AUXOP). MANY ARE ALSO USPS MEMBERS. THE DISTRICT COMMO-DORES CONSTITUTE THE MAJORITY GROUP ON THE NATIONAL AUXILIARY BOARD, THE OTHERS BEING THE NATIONAL COMMODORE, VICE COMMODORE, IMMEDIATE PAST COMMODORE, THE CHIEF DIRECTOR OF AUXILIARY (AND NOW AN ASSISTANT CHIEF DIRECTOR), AND THE PRESIDENT, PAST COMMODORE'S ASSN. ALL HAVE EXTRA DUTIES ON NATIONAL COMMITTEES. HERE THEY ARE:

THERE ARE PHOTOGRAPHS OF HELICOPTERS BRINGING IN DOC-TORS AND MEDICAL SUPPLIES, OF CUTTERS RIGG-ING BOATSWAIN'S CHAIRS IN LASHING SEAS, OF PARARESCUE MEN LEAPING INTO THE WAVES TO HITCH A LINE AROUND SOME WOUNDED, UNCONCIOUS FLOTER IN A MAE WEST, OF BURNT OIL SMEARED FACES DRINKING COFFEE IN A GALLEY AND RE-HEARSING THE STORY FOR THE NEXT COCKTAIL PARTY. BUT IT IS THE PEOPLE IN THE LITTLE BOATS IN DIVERSE PLACES FROM THE FLORIDA KEYS TO THE STRAIGHT OF JUAN DE FUCA, AND IN UNLIKELY PLACES LIKE LAKE TAHOE, WHO COME TO KNOW AND APPRECIATE THE COAST GUARD THE MOST. THERE IS HARDLY A MAN OF ANY SPIRIT WHATSOEVER WHO CAN RESIST THE CALL OF THE SEA PARTICULARLY WHEN HE HAS EASY CREDIT! 1000 IT STARTS THIS WAY A MAN FINDS HIMSELF LOOK-ING AT PICTURES OF BOATS IN NEWSPAPERS AND MAGAZINES, AND HIS BLOOD RISES. RE READS ADS TELLING HOW MANY THE BOAT WILL SLEEP, HOW THE SHOWER WORKS, HOW MANY CAN SIT AT A FOLD DOWN TABLE AND HOW EFFICIENTLY THE TOILET WORKS....AND THEN HE READS ABOUT THE TWO GREAT ENGINS AND FEELS THEM THROBBING BENEA-TH HIS FEET. HE ALONE IS IN COMMAND. IN YACHTING CAP, PERHAPS AN ASCOT IF HE THINKS HE CAN GET AWAY IT, DOUBLE BREASTED BLAZER SNEAKERS, WHITE JEANS, HE CRUISES THE MYSTER-IOUS WATERS OF THE WORLD. FROM THE DECK WILL COME THE LAUGHTER OF BEAUTIFUL WOMEN AND THE TINKLE OF ICE CUBES ... WHAT ROMANCE!!!! WHAT TERRIBLE POWER!!! BY GOD, IF HE HAS A BIG ENOUGH BOAT, THEY'LL HAVE TO RAISE THE DRAW-

THEN ONE DAY IE IS AT THE BOAT SHOW. HE WANDERS THROUGH IN A SORT OF A DAZE, RUBBING HIS FINGERS OVER THE HULLS, STANDING AT THE WHEELS, PEERING AT THE RADAR, THE SHIP-TO-SHORE TELEPHONE, THE RADIO AND THE FISH-O-METER, NOT HAVING THE MURKIEST IDEA HOW THEY OPERATE BUT HEARING HIMSELF SHOUTING, "LAND HO!" AND WATCHING THE NATIVE GIRLS SWIMMING OUT TO PELT HIM WITH GARDENIAS. ONLY, TO APPROVE FULLY, THE COAST GUARD INSISTS ON ONE CUSHION TO A PASS-ENGER. NEVER-THE-LESS HE YANKS ON THE START-ER CORD, TURNS THE THROTTLE IN THE HANDLE GRIP AND SUDDENLY THERE IT IS!!!!! HIS OWN WAKE!!! HE IS NELSON, COOK, AHAB. THE MARINA FADES BEHIND THEM. ENGINEER WITH 14 YEARS SERVICE. "HE DOESN'T
KNOW IF THE CHART IS MARKED IN FEET OR FATH-OMS. HE PROBABLY DOESN'T KNOW IF THERE IS SUCH A THINK AS A CHART. BUT OFF HE GOES, AND WE PRAY WE'LL BE ABLE TO FIND HIM."

IN GALVESTON, AS IN ANYPLACE ELSE, THE SAILOR IS CONSIDERED MORE IMPORTANT THAN THE BOAT, GRANTED THE BOAT WILL FLOAT AT ALL. A MAN WHO KNOWS WHAT HE IS UP TO CAN STAY IN T THE GULF FOR A LONG TIME IN A 16 FOOT OUT-BOARD. BUT IF HE TURNS TO FULL THROTTLE AND TRIES TO SKIM THE WAVES, HE IS A S.A.R. CASE BEFORE HE HAS SUNG HIS FIRST SEA CHANTY. TAKE THE SIMPLE ACT OF STANDING UP. AN AMAZING NUMBER OF PEOPLE GET HURT BY STANDING UP IN A PLEASURE CRAFT. THE BOAT HITS A WAVE AND THE JOLT TO THE STIFF LEGGED CAN BREAK A MAN'S ANKLES.

THE COAST GUARD HAS LESS OF A PROBLEM WITH SAILBOATS. SAILING IS NOT ONLY A JOY, IT IS HARD WORK AND VERY TRICKY. PEOPLE WITH NO TRAINING ORDINARILY CANNOT GET A SAILBOAT FAR ENOUGH FROM THE DOCK TO CAUSE A SEARCH. BUT ANYBODY CAN DRIVE A POWER-BOAT. IN JUNE, WHEN SCHOOL IS OUT, GALVE-STON AND ANY OTHER AREA OF THE COUNTRY THAT HAS WATER DEEP ENOUGH TO FLOAT A HAT BECOMES A CONTINUAL REGATTA UNTIL AUTUMN. FATHERS, MOTHERS, SONS, DAUGHTERS, AUNTS, UNCLES, THE WHOLE BUNCH....THEY GET INTO THEIR LITTLE BOATS AND GO OUT AND SINK THEM. OR THEY RUN OUT OF GAS. THE COAST GUARD SIGHS AND HAULS THEN OUT AND CARRIES THEM TO SHORE. THE COAST GUARD IS USED TO THAT. BUT NOW THE COAST GUARD AT GALVESTON HAS A NEW PROBLEM,, THE SURFERS HAVE COME.

GALVESTON IS A LONG, SKINNY ISLAND OFF THE TEXAS COAST, A SANDBAR WITH A GOOD HIGH SEAWALL, A FORMER REFUGE FOR THE PIRATE JEAN LAFITTE.

IN THE HURRICANE SEASON THE ISLAND LIES OPEN TO THE BIG WINDS COMMING UP THE GULF. FIVE YEARS AGO HURRICANE CARLA ALMOST TORE BALVESTON APART, KNOCKING OVER PALMS AND 7 17 AUGUST 1966 FLOTILLA #79 FORKED RIVER, N.J.

"OPERATION 'SAFETY AT SEA' "

DURING THE PAST SUMMER MONTHS SEVERAL BOATS HAVE CAUGHT FIRE AND BURNED IN THE BARNEGAT BAY AREA, INCLUDING AN AUXILIARY BOAT FROM FLOTILLA 79, CAUSING SERIOUS INJURY TO THE PEOPLE INVOLVED AND HOSPITALIZING THEM FOR A LONG PERIOD OF TIME.

FORKED RIVER FLOTILLA 79, FLOTILLA CMDR. WAYNE MCVEIGH AND THE OWNERS OF 'BUCCANEER MARINA' IN FORKED RIVER DECIDED TO DO SOME-THING ABOUT THE SITUATION. TO BRING TO THE ATTENTION OF THE PUBLIC THE DANGER OF EXPLOS-ION AND HOW TO PREVENT AND FIGHT FIRES ONBOARD THEIR BOATS. AS A CONSEQUENCE 'OPERATION SAFETY AT SEA' WAS BORN.

ON SUNDAY, JULY 31ST A DEMONSTRATION WAS HELD AT 'BUCCANEER MARINA' SPONSORED

BY THE MARINE OFFICE OF AMERICA AND THE WALTER KIDDE COMPANY, COOPERATING WITH FLOTILLA 79 AND BUCCANEER MARINA. THE CLIMAX OF THE DEMONSTRATIONS WAS THE ACTUAL BURNING OF A 28'

CABIN CRUISER. CHIEF ROBERT GOODENOUGH, COMMANDER OF BARNEGAT LIGHT COAST GUARD STATION, STATIONED A 40' COAST GUARD PATROL BOAT AT THE MARINA MANNED BY COAST GUARD PERSONELL WHO ANSWERED QUESTIONS AND EXPLAINED THE NEW VENTILATION REQUIREMENTS & THEY ALSO CONDUCTED A TOUR OF THE BOAT TO THOSE INTERESTED.

THE WALTER KIDDE COMPANY GAVE ACTUAL DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE VARIOUS SIZES AND TYPES OF FIRE EXTINGUISHERS AND OTHER FIRE FIGHTING

EQUIPMENT FOR USE ON BOATSO

THE LACEY TOWNSHIP FIRST AID SQUAD GAVE
AN IN THE WATER DEMONSTRATION OF A RESCUE AT
SEA. THEY ALSO DEMONSTRATED MOUTH TO MOUTH ARTIFICIAL RESPIRATION, PROPER PROCEDURE IN THE USE OF OXYGEN FOR DROWNING AND HEART CASES AND FIRST AID IN THE TREATMENT OF BURNS.

THE NEW JERSEY MARINE POLICE STATIONED A PATROL BOAT AT THE MARINA CAPTAINED BY AL WRIGHT WHO GAVE OUT PAMPHLETS AND EXPLAINED NEW JERSEY MARINE REGULATIONS GOVERNING BOATS. THEY ALSO MADE A LANDING AND A TAKEOFF AT THE MARINA IN A HELICOPTER MANNED BY CAPTAIN AL

FLOTILLA 79 DISPLAYED A 33' PACEMAKER AUXILIARY BOAT CAPTAINED BY ED BOWKER, WHICH WAS EQUIPPED WITH ALL SAFETY EQUIPMENT REQUIRED BY THE U.S. COAST GUARD AND THE U.S. COAST GUARD AUXILIARY AND THE REQUIRED VENT-LATION WHICH ALL BOATS MUST HAVE BY JUNE OF 1967. THE BOAT WAS MANNED BY MEMBERS OF FLOTILLA 79 WHO ANSWERED QUESTIONS PERTAINING TO SAFETY EQUIPMENT AND VENTILATION. THREE COURTESY EXAMINERS OF FLOTILLA 79 WERE ON HAND AND MADE EXAMINATIONS OF BOATS IN THE MARINA.

FLOTILLA COMMANDER DALLAS E MCVEIGH AND MEMBERS OF FORKED RIVER BAY FLOTILLA 78 MANNED A BOOTH FOR GIVE AWAY SAFETY MATERIALS AND ANSWERED QUESTIONS PERTAINING TO SAFETY EQUIPMENT AND VENTILATION. THEY ALSO DISPENSED FREE REFRESHMENTS TO THE PUBLIC, COURTESY OF BUCCANEER MARINA.

FLOTILLA 79 PRESENTED COLOR MOVIES OF U. S. COAST GUARD SEARCH AND RESCUE AND THE FILM OF THE UNSINKABLE 44 FOOTER ON ITS SHAKE DOWN CRUISE. THESE MOVIES WERE SHOWN TWICE TO A CAPACITY CROWD OF THREE HUNDRED AT EACH SHOWNING.

AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE DEMONSTRATIONS THE 28' BOAT WAS BURNED. THE FIRST FIRE WAS IGNITED IN THE CABIN OF THE BOAT TO DEMON-STRATE HOW A FIRE COULD START FROM THE STOVE IN THE GALLEY AND SPREAD THROUGH THE ENTERIOR OF THE CABIN IN A MATTER OF MINUTES. THIS FIRE WAS EXTINGUISHED BY THE LACEY TOWNSHIP VOL. FIRE COMPANY.

THE SECOND FIRE WAS IGNITED IN THE COCKPIT OF THE BOAT TO DEMONSTRATE THE COCKPIT OF THE BOAT TO DEMONSTRATE THE RAPIDITY IN WHICH A FIRE WOULD SPREAD FANNED BY A STIFF BREEZE TO COVER THE ENTIRE BOAT. IT WAS EXPLAINED TO THE AUDIENCE THAT THIS DEMONSTRATION COULD NOT BE GIVEN USING GASOLINE AS FUEL, THAT IF GASOLINE HAD BEEN USED THERE WOULD HAVE BEEN AN INSTANT EXPLOSION GIVING THE PEOPLE ABOARD LITTLE OR NO CHANGE TO LEAVE THE VESSEL NO CHANCE TO LEAVE THE VESSEL.

THE FIRE ENGULFED THE ENTIRE BOAT WITH-IN FIVE MINUTES AND WAS VISUAL PROOF THAT ANYONE ON BOARD WOULD BARELY HAVE HAD TIME TO GRAB A LIFE PRESERVER AND GO OVER THE SIDE. AT THIS POINT IT WAS DRIVEN HOME TO THE PEOPLE IN ATTENDANCE THE GREAT NECESSITY FOR THE NEW COAST GUARD APPROVED VENTILATION

THIS FIRE WAS ALSO EXTINGUISHED IN RECORD TIME BY THE LACEY TOWNSHIP VOL. FIRE COMPANY. BETWEEN SIX AND SEVEN HUNDRED PEOPLE WERE IN ATTENDANCE AT OPERATION 'SAFETY AT SEA' AND IT WAS SO ENTHUSIASTICALLY RECIEVED BY THE PUBLIC THAT IT WAS DECIDED TO MAKE THIS ANNUAL EVENT AT BUCCANEER MARINA IN FORKED RIVER, N. J. AND WILL BE SPONSORED ANNUALLY BY U. S. COAST GUARD AUXILIARY, FLOTILLA 79, MARINE OFFICE OF AMERICA, WALTER KIDDE COMPANY AND BUCCANEER MARINA.

A TELEGRAM WAS RECIEVED FROM GOVERNOR RICHARD J. HUGHES OF NEW JERSEY, CONGRATULATING ALL THOSE WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE

OPERATION TO MAKE IT A SUCCESS.
THE RESIDENTS OF FORKED RIVER AREA WERE APPRECIATIVE OF THE DEMONSTRATIONS THAT THE MAYOR OF LACEY TOWNSHIP HAS PLACED HIS STAMP OF APPROVAL BY ANNOUNCING THAT HENCE FORTH THERE WILL BE A PROCLAMATION ISSUED FOR "SAFETY AT SEA DAY" IN FORKED RIVER ANNUALLY.

NEW JERSEY:

NEW JERSEY ANGLERS ARE ENJOYING EXCELLENT AND VARIED FISHING IN LAKE WAWAYANDA, SUSSEX COUNTY, A GREEN ACRES PURCHASE OF THE DEPT. OF CONSERVATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

PERSONNELL OF THE DEPT. DIVISION OF FISH AND GAME WERE ENTHUSIASTIC ABOUT THE FISHING POTENTIAL OF THE 225 ACRE LAKE WITH IT WAS BOUGHT IN THE SPRING OF 1964. RECENT REPORTS FROM THE DIVISION OF PARKS, FORESTRY AND RECR EATION, BASED ON RECORDS OF MAJOR CATCHES KEPT BY THE BOAT CONCESSIONAIRE, BEAR OUT THIS OPT-IMISM. ANGLERS HAD GOOD SUCCESS BOTH WITH EXPERIMENTALLY STOCKED TROUT AND GREAT NORTH-ERN PIKE AND WITH NATIVE POPULATIONS OF LARGE MOUTH BASS, PICKEREL AND OTHER SPECIES.

ABOUT FOUR DOZEN BROWN TRO T BETWEEN ONE AND FIVE POUNDS WERE CAUGHT IN THE SPRING AND SUMMER OF 1966, HALF OF THEM EXCEEDING 2 1/2 POUNDS IN WEIGHT; IN ADDITION, A PAIR OF RAINBOWS MEASURING 17 1/2 TO 19 INCHES WERE TAKEN. A NUMBER OF THESE FISH MUST HAVE BEEN HOLDOVERS FROM THE 64-65 STOCKINGS WHICH GREW ON THE BUNDANT HERRING FORAGE IN THE LAKE.

AT LEAST HALF A DOZEN NORTHERN PIKE WERE CAUGHT DURING THE SAME PERIOD. THESE MEASURED BETWEEN 20 & 27" AND WEIGHTED BETWEEN 2 AND 6 1/2 POUNDS. A NUMBER OF PIKE WERE CAUGHT IN THE SUMMER OF 65 AND EARLY 66.

THESE FISH CAME FROM A FALL 64 STOCKING OF NEARLY 100 PIKE IMPORTED FROM NEBRASKA. THEY AVERAGED A LITTLE OVER 10 1/2 INCHES WHEN THEY WERE STOCKED.

LAKE WAWAYANDA WAS RECOMMENDED BY FISH-ERIES BIOLOGISTS AS THE MOST SUITABLE WATER IN THE STATE IN WHICH TO INTRODUCE NORTHERN PIKE ON AN EXPERIMENTAL BASIS. A FEW PIKE WERE STOCKED IN POMPTON LAKE AT THAT TIME.

THE PERPETURL TROPHY, TO BE AWARDED EACH YEAR TO THE WINNER OF THE LIGHTNING CLASS SERIES RACES, WAS DONATED BY THE COMMITTEE FOR 100,000 PENNSYLVANIANS.

RACES ARE SCHEDULED TO BE HELD AT 11 AM AND 2:30 PM., D.S.T., ON OCTOBER 8 AND 11 AM OCTOBER 9,1966 ON THE SUSQUEHANNA RIVER AT LONG LEVEL, YORK ys ys, COUNTY. RACES WILL BE SAILED UNDER NORTH AMERICAN YACHT RACING UNION RULES AND PENNSYLVANIA FISH COMMISSION REGATTA SANTION.

THE CUP REGATTA IS OPEN TO ALL LLGHTING SAILORS WHO RESIDE IN PENNA., OR WHO ARE MEMBERS OF A PENNA. CLUB.

PRESENT PLANS CALL FOR THE GOVERNOR OR HIS DESIGNATE TO BE INVITED FOR THE TROPHY PRE-SENTATION TO THE FIRST WINNER OF THE SERIES.

VIRGINIA

WARDENS OF THE VIRGINIA COMMISSION OF GAME AND INLAND FISHERIES APPREHANDED 6,422 PERSONS FOR VIOLATION OF THE GAME, FISH AND BOATING LAWS DURING THE 1965 - 66 FISCAL YEAR, A SLIGHT DECREASE OVER THE 6,810 ARRESTED DURING THE SAME PERIOD A YEAR EARLIER, ASST. LAW ENFORCEMENT CHIEF R. S. PURKS REPORTS. A TOTAL OF 6,043 WERE CONVICTED.

THE 2,751 CONVICTIONS FOR VIOLATION OF THE FISHING LAWS TOPPED THE LIST OF ILLEGAL ACTS. FISHING WITHOUT A LICENSE WAS THE MOST COMMON VILOLATION, BUT THE NUMBER OF FISHING TRESPASS CASES INCREASED. ARRESTS FOR VIO-ALTIONS OF SIZE LIMIT REGULATIONS WERE DOWN AS FISHERMEN APPARENTLY BECAME MORE ACCUSTOMED TO 12 INCH MINIMUM SIZE LIMITS ESTABLISHED ON SOME STREAMS DURING 1964 & 65.

A TOTAL OF 2,520 WERE CONVICTED OF VIO-LATING THE GAME LAWS. TRESPASS CASES, AS USUAL, TOPPED THE HUNTING VIOLATION LIST FOL-LOWED CLOSELY BY HUNTING WITHOUT A LICENSE. CONVICTIONS FOR UNLAWFUL GUNS WERE UP OVER T THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

THE NUMBER OF CONVICTIONS FOR BOTH HUNT-ING AND FISHING WITH IMPROPER LICENSES WAS UP FROM THE PREVIOUS YEAR AS WAS THE NUMBER OF SECOND CONVICTIONS FOR HUNTING AND FISHING VIOLATIONS. OVER 200 HUNTERS AND FISHERMEN HAD THEIR LICENSES REVOKED DURING THE YEAR.

BOAT VIOLATIONS AGAIN DECREASED SLIGHTLY WITH ONLY 772 CONVICTED DURING THE YEAR. EQUIPMENT VIOLATIONS WERE DOWN, BUT THE NUMBER OF CASES OF RECKLESS AND DRUNKEN no no OPERATION INCREASED.

VIRGINIA'S 113 MAN WARDEN AND SUPERVISORY FORCE PUT IN 332,723 MAN HOURS DURING THE YEAR. THEY TRAVELED OVER 3 MILLION MILES BY ROAD AND ALMOST 100,000 MILES BY WATER IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES. THEY CHECKED 84,718 HUNTERS, 144,898 FISHERMEN, AND 40,153

CHESAPEAKE BAY (MARYLAND)

ALTHOUGH WHITE MARLIN HAVE BEEN BOYCOTTING THE ANNUAL OCEAN CITY MARLIN CLUB TOURNAMENT, CHANNEL BASS (RED DRUM) HAVE SHOWN UP IN THE ASSATEAGUE SURF. SEVERAL SMALL BASS IN THE 18 TO 20 POUND CLASS WERE TAKEN OF THE WEEK END BY SURF CASTERS.

SURFERMEN FISHING THE BEACH FOR CHANNEL BASS WILL FIND FRESH FINGERLING MULLET OR OTHER FRESH FISH SUCH AS BUNKER OR NORFOLK SPOT WORK WELL FOR RED FISH.

ALSO, THE ASSATEAGUE ISLAND SURF IS PROV-IDING GOOD CATHES OF KING FISH IN THE 3/4 LB RANGE. PEELER CRAB, SQUID STRIPS OR BLOOD-WORMS WORK EQUALLY AS WELL.

OFF SHORE, SPORT FISHERMEN ARE FINDING FAIR NUMBERS OF FALSE ALBACORE IN THE 8 TO 12 POUND RANGE; OCEANIC BONITO WEIGHING UP TO 5 POUNDS; DOLPHIN UP TO 33 POUNDS; TUNA IN THE 50 POUND CLASS AND WAHOO WEIGHING AS MUCH AS 38 POUNDS. ALL OF THESE FISH WILL HIT THE SQUID, MULLET, EEL AND FRESH STRIP BAITS NORMALLY TROLLED FOR WHITE MARLIN. BILLFISH ARE STILL SCATTERED AND APPARENTLY ARE STAY-ING TO THE NORTH OF OCEAN CITY WHERE HUGE AMOUNTS OF FRESH BAIT IS STILL CONCENTRATED.

IN SHORE, THE BRIDGES AND DOCKS STILL OFFER GOOD FLOUNDER FISHING FOR BOTTOM FISHER-MEN USING SHINERS OR MINNOWS. JETTY JOCKIES ARE MAKING FAIR CATCHES OF SMALL ROCK ON BUCK-TAILS AND PLUGS. IN SINEPUXENT BAY, FRESH BAITS ARE ATTRACTING FAIR NUMBERS OF TROUT AND KING FISH.

PAN SIZE STRIPERS ARE IN GOOD NUMBERS AROUND THE HOOPER ISLAND BRIDGE. TROLLERS US-ING BUCKTAILS ARE PICKING UP 10 TO 15 PAN SIZED ROCK AROUND SHARK FIN LIGHT.

FROM THE GOOSES TO THE STONEROCK, BLUE-FISH RUNNING FROM 1 1/2 TO 4 POUNDS (HO!) ARE STRIKING A VARIETY OF TROLLED LURES. CHOPPERS ARE ALSO PLENTIFUL FROM TILGHMAN ISLAND AND POPLAR ISLAND TO THE CROSS FENCE BUOY. ROCK IN THAT SAME AREA ARE RANGING FROM 1 1/2 TO 2 1/2 POUNDS AND PREFER SOFT SHELL CLAM CHUM. SMALL SPOT ARE ABUNDANT AROUND TILGHMAN AND WILL TAKE ANY FRESH BAIT.

IN THE MOUTH OF EASTERN BAY AND THE MILES RIVER, ROCK WEIGHING UP TO 3 POUNDS ARE HITTING TROLLED BUCKTAILS, SOFT SHELL CLAMS OR PEELER CRAB BAITS. LARGE WHITE PERCH ARE ALSO ABUND-ANT IN THE MILES AS ARE SPOT FROM EASTERN BAY

TO THE WYE RIVER.

IN THE SUSQUEHANNA RIVER, A FEW LARGEMOUTH BASS HAVE BEGUN TO MOVE AND ARE HITTING ART-IFICIAL LURES, PLUGS OR SPINNERS. A FEW ROCK HAVE BEEN CAUGHT AROUND THE KENNEDY BRIDGE AND UP TO PORT DEPOSIT ON JUNE BUG SPINNERS. ALSO IN THE SUSQUEHANNA AND ON THE FLATS SMALL CATFISH ARE TAKING BOTTOM FISHED SHRIMP.

DOWN THE WESTERN SHORE IN THE BAY BRIDGE AREA, WHITE PERCH AND SMALL SPOT ARE PLENTIFUL FOR STILL FISHERMEN FROM SANDY POINT TO THOMAS POINT. STRIPERS WEIGHING TO 15 POUNDS ARE BEING CAUGHT FROM THE BRIDGE TO THOMAS POINT LIGHT ON TROLLED SPOONS AND BUCKTAILS. ALONG THE EASTERN SHORE FROM THE BRIDGE TO BLOODY P POINT TROLLERS ARE PICKING UP STRIPERS FROM THE 12 INCH MINIMUM TO VERY LARGE.

IN THE PATUXENT RIVER ROCK AND BLUES WEIG-HING UP TO 3 POUNDS ARE ABUNDANT FROM ROCK PT. TO POINT NO POINT AND WILL TAKE TROLLED LURES

AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY.

NEW JERSEY....'TOWNSEND INLET'... Towsend inlet buoy 'B' has been moved to a new position 1,950 yards 101° from standpipe, Avalon, in 6 feet of water to properly mark channel...USC&GS #826SC

NEW JERSEY & DELAWARE - DELAWARE BAY...Delaware River...On or about 28 September 1966, FINNS POINT JETTY LIGHT structure will be replaced and equipped with a black and white checkered square daymark facing 025° and 205°. Height of light will be 30 feet above the water. no change in candlepower or red sector alignment. USC&GS #294.

DELAWARE AND NEW JERSEY - DELAWARE BAY -Delaware River - Present regulations require that any aid to navigation maintained and operated by the Coast Guard to serve the needs of commerce must be necessary for the safety of navigation, useful to commerce, of a substantial and permanent character, and must be justified in terms of public benefit to be derived therefrom. NEW CASTLE FLATS BUOY 29 is not considered to meet these requirements and is being considered for discontinuance. Written comments on this proposal are being soicited from interested parties. Any objection raised should state the facts on which it is based and the need for the retention of this aid. PENNSYLVANIA & NEW JERSEY - Delaware River -The corps of engineers advised that their derrickboat and diver are conductiong operations for about 30 days in the center and easterly part of the Delaware River ship channel. Since explosives may be used, mariners should avoid the use of radio and raday trasm missions when passing this site. Mariners are requested to use the westerly part of the channel and to exercise extreme caution in this vicinity. USC&GS CHART 295

PENNSYLVANIA AND NEW JERSEY - Deleware River -The corps of engineers advises that test borings are in progress along both sides of the navigable channel in Cooper River approximately 0.3 mile upstream from the County drawbridge at East State Street, Camden, New Jersey. A barge will work in this area during daylight hours for about three weeks. Mariners are requested to exercise caution in passing this site. USC&GS CHARTS: 280 &295.

MARYLAND-CHESAPEAKE BAY-CHESAPEAKE CHANNEL -Current Buoy established The U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey advises that a current test buoy has been estaglished in about 86 feet of water for 45 days at approximate position latitude 38°54'2 North, Longitude 76° 23'2 West. The buoy is boat shap ed, 10 ft. long by 5 ft wide, painted orange and white a and showing a quick flashing white light of low candelpower. The buoy contains delicate instruments and mariners are requested to remain well clear..... C&GS CHARTS 550,1225.

MARYLAND - CHESAPEAKE BAY - CHESAPEAKE CHANNEL Reef constructed, buoy established The department of Chesapeake Bay Affairs, State of Maryland, Annapolis, Maryland advises that a fishing reef constructed with pneumatic tires individually weighted with concrete and occupying a rectangular area 100 feet by 200 feet, with a depth of 14 feet at MLW over the reef, has been construcged at approximate position Latitude 38°50'4 North, 76°27'7 West. A mine type buoy, painted with orange and white horozontal bands has been established to mark the reef. Mariners are advised to exercise caution when transiting the area. C&GS Charts 550, 1225.

JOHN RECIEVED HIS TEN YEAR AUXILIARY SERVICE RIBBON THIS YEAR.
